I can certainly empathize with you about the challenges that lay ahead to grow an unknown sport in an already crowded American sporting arena. However from what I've seen, Netball America is on the right path. The key will be to support the growth of the game amongst the youth. I encourage you all to consider the role you can play to assist in this growth. It's about having a greater purpose, and thinking beyond yourself, so, in drawing from my culture and rugby experiences I want to leave you with one last thought:

Our hearts are then ready to play, which carries us when our feet don't know the way."

### **About Waisale Serevi**

Known the world round as The King of Sevens, Waisale Serevi hardly needs introduction! His blend of power, speed and spatial awareness lifted him from humble roots to the fore of Fijian rugby over a career that spanned two decades.

Since making his 1989 debut in the Hong Kong 7's, Serevi has captivated the world with his skills, balance and staggering pace. His creative flair and power led Serevi's Fiji squad to unprecedented success, including Serevi's seven Rugby World Cup appearances and two Rugby World Cup 7's Championships. Serevi was one of the few players to play both fifteens and sevens formats, the former taking him to play for clubs in England, France and Japan.

As a global ambassador for the game, Serevi has served as player, captain and coach on five continents. He was instrumental in working with the International Olympic Committee (IOC) to return rugby to the Olympic Games. And in Copenhagen, on October 7, 2009, the IOC voted to include Rugby 7's in the 2016 Summer Olympics in Rio de Janeiro, Brazil.
